Master of comedy theatre, Christopher Durang, takes characters and themes from Chekhov, pours them into a blender and mixes them up. The utterly hilarious and occasionally touching result is Durang's latest play, set in the present, in Bucks County, Pennsylvania. Vanya and his adopted sister Sonia



have lived their entire lives in the family's farmhouse. But while they stayed home to take care of their ailing parents, their sister Masha has been gallivanting around the world as a successful actress and movie star, leaving Vanya and Sonia to feel trapped and regretful. Their soothsayer/cleaning woman Cassandra keeps warning them about terrible things in the future, which include a sudden visit from Masha and her twenty-something boy toy Spike.

In what will be the 6th show of the Oyster Mill Playhouse 2016 Season, Director Lois Heagy is seeking to cast 2 men and 4 women. Please note that this show contains several instances of profanity in the script which will not be deleted.

Auditions will be conducted over two nights: Sunday, June 5th and Monday June 6th, both at 7:00pm. Callbacks will also be Monday, June 6th at

8:00pm. Auditions will consist of cold readings from the script. The auditions will be held at the Playhouse, which is located at 1001 Oyster Mill Rd, Camp Hill, PA.

PRIDE FESTIVAL OF CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA

Oyster Mill Playhouse plans to have an information booth at the 2016 Pride Festival of Central Pennsylvania which will be held on Saturday, July 30, 2016 at Riverfront Park in Harrisburg. from 11:00 am to-6:00 pm. Oyster Mill will be 1 of 32 exhibitors at the event, among exhibitors such as AARP Pennsylvania, Classic Dry Cleaners, Green Mountain Energy, Market Square Presbyterian Church, Renewal by Anderson, and the Sierra Club, to name just a few. The event is sponsored this year by Erie Insurance and 15 other sponsors including Giant, Highmark, Hershey Entertainment & Resorts, and PNC, among others.

The Pride Festival regularly attracts 5,000 people to Harrisburg. With limited space available, its organizers strive to provide exposure to a variety of businesses and associations and limit the number of exhibitors. Oyster Mill Playhouse is the only theatre organization exhibiting at this year's Festival.

The mission of the Pride Festival organization is to increase positive visibility of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender (LGBT) community of Central Pennsylvania by providing opportunities to express and celebrate diverse perspectives, emphasizing acceptance of all individuals regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression. The organization is dedicated to providing a safe environment for people of the LGBT and Straight Ally community to celebrate their diversity while supporting local economic growth by partnering with the community and attracting individuals to Central Pennsylvania.
